- Malyon College has realized the need for those in country areas and for those who are not able to conveniently come to the campus, to be able to study, and the College is now progressively offering the first year of the Bachelor of Ministry and Master of Divinity (GradDipDiv) degree by distance education.
- Subjects are provided through our Moodle teaching site (or CD-Rom) and students will require Internet access in order to use the site and email for correspondence and in some subjects to participate in discussion forums organised by the Lecturer.
- The cost is the same as for those attending College.
- The distance material is available in the first year of —
 - Degree (BMin/BTh/BChrisStud) [300 level subjects]
 - Graduate Diploma/Masters (MDiv, GradDipDiv) [500 level subjects]

The subjects we offer by distance are accredited through the Australian College of Theology which is an approved provider for FEE-HELP.

We plan to eventually offer our eight first year subjects by distance. If you wish to pursue further study by distance, you can continue to study through Morling College (the Baptist College in NSW) which offers a full distance degree through ACT.

OLD TESTAMENT

The Old Testament Introduction subjects form the foundation upon which all further study of the Old Testament builds. They will look at biblical history as it is recorded in the Old Testament, in the light of the various ancient contexts of the biblical narrative, illustrated by modern archaeological findings. The aim is to —

- ❖ acquire an overall acquaintance with the text of the Old Testament
- ❖ gain an overall historical framework
- ❖ understand the major theological themes of the Old Testament and their significance for Christian theology
- ❖ consider the implications of the Old Testament for Christian life and thought

OT301/501 Formative Old Testament Traditions

Creation (with special reference to Genesis 1-3); Patriarchs; Exodus; Conquest; Rise of the Monarchy and the Division of the Kingdom.

OT302/502 From Israel to Judea

Prophets; Final years of Judah; Exile; Post-exilic restoration; Wisdom literature and Apocalyptic literature

NEW TESTAMENT

The New Testament subjects form the foundation upon which all further study of the New Testament builds to enable students to gain a firm understanding of the ministry of Jesus and the contents, themes and theology of various books of the New Testament. The aim is to -

- ❖ enable an understanding of the ministry of Jesus in its historical, cultural, religious and political environment
- ❖ give an understanding of the evangelists with their own distinctive theologies and outlooks
- ❖ reflect on the significance of the New Testament for our own lives and ministry

NT301/501 Content & Setting of the Gospel Tradition

Life and ministry of Jesus especially as recorded in the Gospels.

NT302/502 Early New Testament Church

The beginnings and expansion of the church with special attention to the Acts of the Apostles; the teaching and main issues confronted in the New Testament epistles.

CHURCH HISTORY

CH305/505 Early Church History

A survey of major developments in the history of the Christian church to AD451. The aim is to develop a fuller appreciation of key theological debates in the early Church.

CH302/502 Church from 1550 to Modern Times

Reformation, Denominations, Missionary Expansion, Church Universal.
