### LA005-6/812, New Testament Greek A

<b>Description</b>	For everyone who longs to hear the pristine voices of the New Testament writers without the 'static' of translations, this unit is for you. We'll take the first steps towards developing a working knowledge of Koinē (' <i>koi-nay</i> ') Greek, the language in which the New Testament was originally written. Look, it's a fair bit of work, but the rewards are great.	
<b>Content</b>	We'll work through the first half of one of the standard introductions to New Testament Greek (the details of the essential textbook are listed below). You'll learn enough to be able to translate simple verses from the Greek New Testament by the end of the semester, and you'll begin to understand the grammatical issues that influence understanding and translation of the Greek text of the New Testament. <b>AQF 8 students</b> additionally work on some translation from English to Greek, comparison of translations, and some more advanced material.
