Description	<p>GSF at Malyon is central to our commitment to <i>form faithful image-bearers of Christ</i>. Such formation is the work of a lifetime but its inclusion during study for an academic award recognises that knowledge alone cannot enable us to fully <i>serve the church, engage our culture or carry out our commitment to the mission of God in his world</i>. We must not only <i>know about God</i> but also deepen and strengthen our <i>relationship with him</i>.</p> <p>Accordingly, we seek to become those whose lives are growing in Christlikeness as we integrate all that we learn with our personal discipleship.
