### PC121-612 & 712, Theology for Everyday Life

<b>Description</b>	<p>“There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign overall, does not cry, Mine!” (Abraham Kuyper). Yet we often tend to compartmentalise the “spiritual/Sunday” part of our lives from the “secular/Monday to Saturday” part. This unit aims to bridge that gap, to make the connections between what we believe and how we live, and to understand how the Lordship of Christ relates to every square inch of our lives.</p>	
<b>Content</b>	<p><b>Section A: Theological Reflection on Everyday Life</b> A reflective study of the routine activities of daily life; the culture within which daily life is lived; personal relationships; and major social structures as contexts for ministry.</p> <p><b>Section B: Personal Reflection on Everyday Life</b> Biography and spiritual autobiography as categories of Christian theology; prayer, meditation, and the practice of the presence of God in everyday life; personal beliefs, values, commitments, and loyalties; the planning and management of personal ministry and development.</p> <p><b>Section C: Lay Ministry in Practice</b> Students are to undertake substantial autobiographical work (with supervised reflection), including the use of a journal, and a written review of their use of time.</p>
